The Colorado Watershed Assembly has compiled a list of governmental and non-governmental funding sources for restoration projects and organizational capacity building. The list can be found on our [website](#).

River Network/MillerCoors Watershed Protection Grants

Projects that are eligible for funding will be focused on agricultural and water issues. This may include working with agriculture organizations, individual farmers, Soil & Water Conservation Districts or others involved with the farming community. Projects will be expected to provide long-term benefits to water quality, quantity and/or public education. Proposals are due on **February 8, 2010**. National Fish and Wildlife Foundation: Five-Star Restoration Matching Grants Program

This program supports community-based wetland, riparian, and coastal habitat restoration projects throughout the United States. Grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$40,000 are provided to projects that build diverse partnerships and foster natural resource stewardship through education, outreach, and training activities. Partnerships should include at least five organizations (nonprofit organizations, government agencies, educational institutions, businesses, etc.) that contribute to project success through funding, land, workforce support, technical support, and/or other in-kind services. Projects that can leverage the amount of funds requested with significant cash or in-kind contributions from project partners are given priority. The application deadline is **February 11, 2010**. EPA Five-Star Restoration Program

This program provides modest financial assistance on a competitive basis to support community-based wetland, riparian, and coastal habitat restoration projects that build diverse partnerships and foster local natural resource stewardship through education, outreach and training activities. Model Forest Policy Program

The purpose of the Climate Solutions University (CSU) is to guide and empower local communities in resource rich areas to develop local forest and water climate action plans. The four steps of the community process are: 1) Community decides to take leadership action; 2) Local conditions are assessed for resource vulnerabilities and action opportunities for forest, water and land use planning and practices; 3) Strategies and recommendations are developed; and 4) Actions are implemented, monitored and evaluated for impacts and benefits. This ten month CSU project will guide selected communities through the first three steps and prepare them for action implementation in 2011. The due date is **Feb 22, 2010**. Grants Preserve Natural Areas in Colorado

The mission of the Great Outdoors Colorado Trust Fund is to help preserve and manage Colorado's wildlife, park, river, trail, and open space heritage. In the spring of 2010, the Fund will provide support through the following grant programs: Local Government Parks and Outdoor Recreation Grants assist in the

establishment or expansion of park, outdoor recreation, and environmental education facilities. (Mini-Grants are provided for projects in communities of 5,000 people or less.) Open Space Grants support projects that protect natural areas such as urban open space, wildlife habitat, etc. Conservation Excellence Grants target activities which improve the capacity of land trusts to achieve quality land conservation. Planning Grants help communities develop plans to protect open space, wildlife habitat, and parks. The application deadlines are as follows: Open Space Grants: **February 22, 2010**; Local Government Parks and Outdoor Recreation Grants, Mini-Grants, and Planning Grants: **March 2, 2010**; and Conservation Excellence Grants: **March 8, 2010**. Non-profit or government organizations in any country may apply for grant funding, but projects should take place in the following Methane to Markets Partner countries: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, China, Colombia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Georgia, India, Kazakhstan, Republic of Korea, Mexico, Mongolia, Nigeria, Pakistan, Philippines, Poland, Russia, Thailand, Ukraine, and Vietnam. 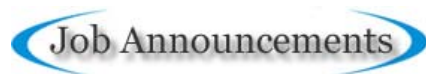

EPA's Budget Proposal Seeks Efficiencies, Increased Environmental Protection

The Obama Administration today proposed a budget of \$10 billion for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). This budget heeds the president's call to streamline and find efficiencies in the agency's operations while supporting the seven priority areas EPA Administrator Lisa P. Jackson outlined to guide EPA's work. "To meet our environmental challenges and ensure fiscal responsibility, we're proposing targeted investments in core priorities.
