FUND OVERVIEW





LOAN PROGRAM





Typically \$50M available from CWCB cash funds

- Loans for water supply projects such as:
 - Reservoir rehabilitation or new construction, ditches & canals, pipelines, river diversion structures, water rights purchases, and hydropower projects
- Applications are accepted year-round*

WATER PROJECT LENDING





Agricultural Borrowers

- 50% of Market Interest Rate
- Mutual Ditch Companies or Private
- Revenue: Assessments
- Collateral Decisions
- Average Operating Cost \$10-\$20/AF

Municipal Borrowers

- Median Income Sets Interest Rate
- Tabor Controls
- Enterprises
- Loan Security
- Pledge Tax or Rates, No Tap Fees
- Avg Water Bill \$30-\$60/month
- Avg Debt \$2.5K-\$5K/tap



WATERSHED RESTORATION






Typically \$2M to \$5M available annually

- Grants for watershed/stream restoration and flood mitigation projects
- May be used for planning and engineering studies
- Special consideration for projects that integrate multiple objectives in restoration and flood mitigation
- Special funding for post-wildfire mitigation
- Will become part of the Water Plan Grant Program on July 1, 2022

CWRP PROJECT EXAMPLE





San Juan Basin Integrated Water Management Plan

- Currently in Phase III, which will focus on prioritizing projects
- Phase I focused on creating a stakeholder group and reviewing data
- Phase II focused on assessing consumptive and non-consumptive water needs

CWRP PROJECT EXAMPLE







Prairie Stream
Restoration in the
Lower Arkansas
River Basin

- Watershed restoration in two Colorado prairie reserves
- Aims to restore erosion-driven damage to water resources and increase riparian habitat function

WATER SUPPLY RESERVE FUND






Funding levels vary annually

- Funded from Severance Tax
- Provides grants to address water supply issues (both planning and construction)
- Funding must first be approved by local roundtable
- Contact local basin for application deadlines

WSRF PROJECT EXAMPLE







WATER PLAN GRANTS





Typically \$7 to \$9 M available annually

- Storage and supply/demand gap (New storage)
- Conservation, land use, & drought planning
- Engagement and Innovation
- Agricultural projects
- Environmental & Recreation projects
- Preference given to projects w/ multiple benefits/purposes
- Applications due July 1 & December 1

APPROVING FUNDING



Application / Review

- Applications due to the CWCB
- Engineering Feasibility Study (loans & storage & supply Water Plan Grants)
- Financial Review (loans)
- Staff, Committee, & Leadership Review
- Board Recommendation
- Board or CWCB Director approval

Post Funding Approval

- Contracting (prior to work starting)
- Disbursements made on invoiced work
- Project close out with final report or deliverable
